The Tank Museum is offering a placement for a Cataloguing and Research Assistant to work in the Research Department team.

This will provide a hands-on opportunity to work on cataloguing and research within the Tank Museum Research Team. The museum's Archive is a place of deposit for the National Archives and the UK's foremost research centre on the subject of armoured warfare.

The Tank Museum was founded in 1923 as a teaching resource for engineers and soldiers of the Tank Corps. Over recent years, the Museum has dramatically transformed from a training aid for the Army to a 21st century Museum aspiring towards access and excellence for all. Based at Bovington Camp, the home of the tank, the Museum boasts the most comprehensive collection of armoured fighting vehicles in the world. In addition, the Museum has a very strong supporting collection of medals, photographs, film, sound recordings, fine art, books, weapons, models and memorabilia. Current displays tell the story of the tank from its inception in 1915 to the recent war in Afghanistan. The entire collection has Designated Status. In 2018

As part of the Research team Research Assistant will work under the supervision of the Research Project Manager on a range of cataloguing and Archive & Library Projects supporting the work and objectives of The Tank Museum.

At the end of the 6-month period the placement will have gained valuable working experience and training on cataloguing and research. You will have a more compelling CV with hands on experience in cataloguing and research in a large and successful Museum.

A relevant qualification would be desirable with some experience of working in a similar environment. More important is a keen interest in 20th century military history with the desire to pursue a museum or research career.
